


LOCATION —

The Mueller Tunnel was excavated in the early 1900s as part of the Alpine Railway project and was set to connect Mt. Lowe with Mt. Wilson by rail. Named after the artist August Mueller, the oldest known record of the tunnel dates back to an etching made by the artist in 1887. The

tunnel was "finished" in 1942, 4 years after the demise of the Alpine Railway and is currently maintained by the USFS (United States Forestery Service).

The Eaton Saddle / Mueller Tunnel is adjacent to the Gabrielino National Recreation Trail, historically named for the Native populations who were relocated to the San Gabriel Mission. The five tribes of the San Gabriel Mountains: Tongva, Tataviam, Chumash, Kitanemuk, and Serrano used this area as a resting spot on the trek from the desert to the sea or vice versa through which trade was accomplished. Pre-contact local tribes came here to gather the bounty of the mountains (acorn, game, pine nuts, etc.) and renew community ties.*

DIRECTIONS —



Search "Eaton Saddle Trailhead" on Google Maps for turn-by-turn directions or proceed as follows:

- from Downtown take the 5N to the CA-2 and proceed approximately 9 miles north to Exit 20 for the CA-2 / Angeles Crest Hwy toward La Cañada Flintridge
- 2. Take the CA-2 / Angeles Crest Hwy north 14 miles up the hill
- 3. Follow signs to Mt Wilson turn right at the Haramokngna American Indian Cultural Center / Red Box Picnic Area
- 4. Continue straight onto Mt Wilson Red Box Rd for 2.3 miles
- 5. Park at the Eaton Saddle Trailhead
- 6. Proceed up the trail on foot **0.28 miles** to the entrance of the tunnel

Parking is **limited** (capacity around 20 cars) via small lots on both sides of Red Box Canyon Rd. We encourage **CARPOOLING** and ask that you minimize your visibility/noise at the trailhead/parking lots.

Accessibility: Please let us know in advance if you or anyone in your party requires extra assistance getting up the trail.

Drive safely! The road is windy and make sure you have a Designated Driver if so needed. Walk carefully on the trail as some cliffs are steep.

Leave no trace, respect the land. Bring water, snacks, jackets, anything you may need and be mindful with cigarette butts.

DEM PASSWORDS

The Mueller Tunnel is approximately 30 miles north of Downtown LA, a 45 minute drive.

Search **Eaton Saddle Trailhead** on Google Maps for turn-by-turn directions or proceed as follows —

- from Downtown take the 5N to the CA-2 and proceed approximately 9 miles north to Exit 20 for the CA-2 / Angeles Crest Hwy toward La Cañada Flintridge
- take the CA-2 / Angeles Crest Hwy north 14 miles up the hill
- follow signs to Mt Wilson turn right at the Haramokngna American Indian Cultural Center / Red Box Picnic Area
- continue straight onto Mt Wilson Red Box Rd for 2.3 miles
- park at the Eaton Saddle Trailhead
- proceed up the trail on foot .281 miles to the entrance of the tunnel for the jam

TECH CONSIDERATIONS —

If you're performing with outboard gear, we prefer you send us $L + R \frac{1}{4}$ inch inputs — that is to say, please minimize your input list as we're working with a flimsy 8-channel mixer.

Tynacity has graciously offered to bring a Denon DJ Prime 4 standalone DJ system for us to use. She's indicated, however, that her ½ inch headphone jack is on the fritz so please bring an ¼ inch adaptor for your headphones.
